Budget Larger Context

Over the past 3 years, I've communicated info from the NJ Department of Education's Taxpayer Guide to Education Spending with staff and families as we've navigated state aid losses and increasing costs. We are currently in Year 6 of seven straight years of state aid reductions and working on the 2024-25 budget, Year 7. The metrics in that guide show our district has become ever more fiscally efficient, as reflected in our rankings in various indicators showing where we compare to the other K-8 districts in the state with at least 751 students or more. Of particular note: ETSD spends \$2,765 less per student than does the average K-8 district w/751+ students statewide. With our enrollment of 4,457 students, our budget, if equal to the state average, would be over \$12 million dollars greater (\$12,323,605).
